NOTIFICATION FOR THE PUBLIC DISCLOSURE OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT (ESIA) OF KOIDU LIMITED'S EXISTING DIAMOND MINING OPERATION TO REFLECT ITS PLANNED CHANGE FROM AN OPEN PIT TO AN UNDERGROUND MINE

Govt. Notice No. 272

This notice serves to inform interested and/or affected persons/parties (I&APs) of the Environmental and Social Impact Assessment (ESIA) conducted with respect to the commencement of underground mining operations in Koidu Limited's existing operation on the outskirts of the town of Koidu, Kono District, Eastern Sierra Leone.

The mine has been in operation since 2004 and has a mining lease on the area valid till 2030. The financial uncertainties encountered with the open pit mining operation which was on the verge of getting uneconomic, with mining at depth, necessitated the consideration and planning for underground mining. The new underground scheme will have two distinct advantages:

- 1. It will enable Koidu Ltd. to mine more economically and for a longer period with positive consequences for the country, especially its economy; and
- 2. Many of the inimical environmental and social effects experienced with the current open pit operation will be greatly minimised by going underground.

The proposed underground mining operations and the changes in the overall mining operations warrant a comprehensive ESIA which will depict the associated environmental, social and health impacts of the new mining methodology as stipulated in the EPA Act, 2008 & MMA Act 2009.

In terms of international standards and the laws of Sierra Leone, the project needs to be planned and designed in a manner that minimizes the potential negative social and environmental impacts and maximize the benefits. This will be achieved through the ESIA Process that the consultant, CEMMATS Group Ltd. (CEMMATS), an experienced Environmental Assessment consultancy with vast experience of working in the mining sector, and staff of Koidu Limited with considerable experience, not only in the current operation but in underground operations worldwide have undertaken. This collaboration has made for a comprehensive assessment that adequately addresses will the major increase that all the major issues that may arise from the new underground mining operations and ensure that Koidu Limited proceeds with its underground mining whilst adopting sound environmental principles.

Although the ESIA concentrates primarily on the underground mining, the reports also cover the entire operation and therefore include updating the original ESIA done by Digby Wells and Associates in association with CEMMATS in 2012.
