UNDERGROUND MINING OPERATION**

This notice serves to inform interested and/or affected persons/parties (I&APs) about the Environmental and Social Impact Assessment (ESIA) conducted with respect to the commencement of underground mining operations in Tonguma Limited's existing operations in the Lower Bambara Chiefdom, Kenema District, Eastern Sierra Leone.

Tonguma Ltd, previously a subsidiary of Ocea Mining, was established to undertake Kimberlite exploration activities with the issuance of an exploration licence in 2004. In 2016, Stellar Diamonds Ltd, a junior diamond development company with kimberlite assets in West Africa, entered into a binding Tribute Mining Agreement with Tonguma Ltd. Since the completion of the agreement process, Stellar Diamonds Ltd was acquired by Newfield Resources Ltd in May 2018. Newfield Resources, through its subsidiary Sierra Diamonds Ltd, now assumes the sole responsibility for funding and operational development of the Tonguma mine, and intends to include underground mining methods in their operations.

The proposed underground mining operations and the changes in the overall mining operations warrant a comprehensive ESIA which will depict the associated environmental, social and health impacts of the new mining methodology as stipulated in the EPA Act, 2008 & MMA Act 2009.

In terms of international standards and the laws of Sierra Leone, the project needs to be planned and designed in a manner that minimizes the potential negative social and environmental impacts and maximize the benefits. This will be achieved through the ESIA Process that the consultant, CEMMATS Group Ltd. (CEMMATS), an experienced Environmental Assessment consultancy with vast experience of working in the mining sector, and staff of Tonguma Limited/Sierra Diamonds Ltd with considerable experience, not only in the current operation but in underground operations worldwide have undertaken.

This collaboration has made for a comprehensive assessment that adequately addresses all the major issues that may arise from the new underground mining operations and ensure that Tonguma Limited proceeds with its underground mining whilst adopting sound environmental principles.

Although the ESIA concentrates primarily on the underground mining, the reports also cover the entire operation and therefore include updating the original ESIA done by CEMMATS in 2014.
