ESTABLISHMENT OF THE NATIONAL EARLY WARNING AND RESPONSE MECHANISM COORDINATING CENTRE

WHEREAS Sierra Leone is a signatory to the Treaty establishing the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS) signed on 28 May 1975 in Lagos and revised on 24 July 1993 in Cotonou;

WHEREAS Article 58 (f) of the revised ECOWAS Treaty (1993) provides for the establishment of a regional peace and security observance system and peacekeeping forces where appropriate;

WHEREAS Chapter IV of the 1999 Protocol (Mechanism for conflict prevention, management, resolution, peacekeeping and security) provides the framework for the establishment of a sub-regional peace and security system (Early Warning System);

WHEREAS the Strategic framework for the establishment of the National Early Warning and Response Mechanism was adopted by the Heads of State and Government in a communique at the 45th Ordinary Session of ECOWAS, held in Accra on 10-11 July 2014 (Article 5);

WHEREAS, pursuant to the above mentioned communique of the Authority of the Heads of State at their 45th Ordinary Session, the Council of Ministers at its 75th Ordinary Session in Abuja from 13 - 14 December, 2015 promulgated regulations C/REG 12/12/15 on the Establishment of National Early Warning Response Mechanism in Member States;

WHEREAS, in fulfillment of the responsibility of the Government of Sierra Leone to implement Regulations C/REG 12/12/15 on the Establishment of National Early Warning Response Mechanism, The President and Cabinet by Memorandum No. CP (2019) 68 of 6 November 2019, approved the Establishment of the Sierra Leone Early Warning and Response Mechanism Coordinating Centre;

NOW THEREFORE, in the exercise of the power vested in the President as the supreme executive authority of the Republic of Sierra Leone under subsection (1) of section 40 and subsection (1) and (2) of section 53 of the Constitution of Sierra Leone, 1991, (Act No.6 of 1991), the President hereby makes the following Orders:

CHAPTER 1

ESTABLISHMENT AND OBJECTIVE

ARTICLE I

- There is hereby established the National Early Warning and Response Mechanism Coordinating Centre in Sierra Leone.
- The Centre shall undertake strategic research on peace and security issues as well as collect, centralize
 and analyse data or information provided by public institutions, civil society organizations, the ECOWAS
 regional early warning and response Centre, or by any other legitimate information source for its strategic
 objective.
- The Centre shall develop synergies between institutions working in the fight against all forms of human security and organised crime, propose response options to address issues pertaining to peace and security.

CHAPTER 2

ORGANISATION AND OPERATION

ARTICLE 2

- 1. The Centre shall be headquartered in Sierra Leone.
- 2. The Centre shall be under the authority of the Office of the President.
- 3. The operations of the Centre shall be supervised by a Board comprising

The Vice President as Chairman and the following other members:

The Minister of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation;

The Minister of Finance:

The Attorney-General and Minister of Justice;

The Minister of Defence;

The Minister of Internal Affairs;

The Minister of Environment;

A sectorial Minister(s) (depending on the nature of the response);

Representative of Paramount Chiefs in Parliament;

The ECOWAS Permanent Representative.

- The Board shall convene whenever the situation requires it and may invite to its meetings, where necessary, any member of Government or any person whose role it deems useful.
- There shall be a Director appointed by the government who shall be responsible for the operations of the Centre.
- The Director shall be supported by such other staff as may be necessary for carrying out the activities of the Centre.
- 7. The Director shall provide monthly reports to the Board on the operations of the Centre.

ARTICLE 3

There shall be a Liaison Officer, who shall be based in the Office of the ECOWAS Permanent Representative
who shall serve as a direct link between the Centre and the ECOWAS regional early warning and
response Centre.

CHAPTER 3

FINANCIAL PROVISIONS

ARTICLE 4

- 1. The building for the offices of the Centre shall be allocated by the Government of Sierra Leone.
- 2. The operating cost of the Centre shall be borne by the Government of Sierra Leone.
- Pursuant to Regulations C/REG 12/12/15, ECOWAS shall provide technical and capacity building support for the Centre including:
 - a) Office automation equipment and vehicles
 - b) Information and communication technology, including video conferencing systems;
 - c) Acquisition of updated geospatial data, including commercial cards;
 - d) Training of staff of the Centre;
 - e) Support for the engagement of Civil Society Organizations to enable them carry out their response activities in collaboration with the Centre.
- 4. The Centre may receive donations, legacies and contributions.

CHAPTER 4

COOPERATION WITH OTHER PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS

ARTICLE 5

- In furtherance of the objectives of the Centre, national and regional public institutions shall submit to the Centre all information/data or reports that may be required by the Centre.
- The information, data, and reports provided in the context of this cooperation shall remain confidential and can only be made public under conditions and forms prescribed by law.

CHAPTER 5

FINAL PROVISIONS

ARTICLE 6

- 1. The President shall be responsible for the implementation of this Order.
- 2. This Order shall take effect immediately and shall be published in the Sierra Leone Gazette.
