1. *Title of post:* School and Public Library System Development, (P.4).

2. *Location:* IBRD/UNESCO Education Project, Teheran, Iran.

3. *Background:* The Library Technology project of the Government of Iran aims at the establishment of a new National Library System. In the design of the first phase of the project, an effort has been made to develop various components in such a manner as to facilitate their eventual integration into a national system. The project in this stage includes surveys and experimental projects in the field of public and school libraries as well as the development of special information services, national bibliographic control and the training of library manpower. These activities will form the basis for the second stage of the project, which will commence in 1977 applying more mechanization in the library services. The project in the first stage will involve two library specialists, one, an expert for School and Public Library Systems Development and the other, a consultant (8 m/m) for Information and Special Library Network Development.

4. Duties and responsibilities

Under the authority of UNESCO and in close collaboration with UNDP, the Iran IBRD/UNESCO Education Project, and the Institute of Research and Planning in Science and Education, the Specialist will be required to:

- (a) advise on the planning of a public and school library system and participate in the preparation of a plan for long term development of a national information system (NATIS);
- (b) advise on the planning and assist in the organization of model school libraries in various regions of the country to serve demonstration and training purposes;
- (c) plan for the training of school library staff and media specialists and prepare curricula for the introduction of librarianship as a subject in teacher training;
- (d) advise on the organization of public libraries and on the training of their staff as well as making recommendations for more effective utilization of these libraries to the Ministry of Culture and the Arts;
- (e) advise on the selection of materials for school and public libraries in close co-operation with the institutions involved.

5. Qualifications

- (a) University degree and professional qualifications in Librarianship;
- (b) extensive experience in school and/or public library organizations;
- (c) experience in developing countries desirable.

6. *Language requirements.* Good command of written and spoken English. Knowledge of French and Iranian an asset.

7. *Duration:* One year starting as soon as possible after expiry of deadline.

8. International salary and allowances (P-4)

(Net of national income tax—payable partly in the currency of the staff member's home or of the duty station).

Base salary per annum: equivalent to Net \$17,532.

3. *Background*

The Third Education Project or more accurately, The Development of Primary Schools Project (P3D) was established under the Decree of the Minister of Education and Culture No. 102/P/1973. This Decree was issued in order to implement the Pelita * programme in co-operation with the International Development Association under the Credit Agreement signed on 1st June 1973 between the Indonesian Government and IDA. The agreement became effective after the Loan Agreement was signed on 15th August, 1973 with the Canadian International Development Agency.

Within the broad aims of the Government Pelita II and in harmony with national aspirations, the project forms an integrated whole with the other inputs into the primary system. The particular aims of the project are to prepare manuscripts for student textbooks and teachers' guides in the following subjects: Bahasa Indonesia, grades I to VI, Social Studies III to VI, Science IV to VI and Mathematics I to VI. These manuscripts continue to be tested in four randomly chosen try-out areas and the results are collected centrally so that the texts can be refined. Some 138 million copies of the books are to be printed by local firms and distributed free to the pupils of all 70,000 primary schools throughout the country. The other major aims is to up-grade all primary school supervisors, headmasters and teachers by a system of 105 mobile tutors, who themselves have to be trained annually. These mobile tutors, suitably supplied with vehicles and equipment under the project, will operate out of primary teachers colleges (SPGs) selected as Home Bases from where the tutors will travel to central primary schools to conduct their up-grading of the teachers. The operations in the 26 provinces will be co-ordinated by the newly set-up Provincial Project Sub Units (PPSUs) who report to the project headquarters, the Project Implementation Unit (PIU).

The project is closely co-ordinated with other activities in the primary field, for example the primary curriculum development and the INPRES project and all three projects share many of the same Indonesian officers. The PIU and the PPSUs controlling the distribution of books and the conduct of the up-grading in the provinces, constitute the operational framework of the project which is currently estimated at \$63 million.

*Main Activities**(a) Manuscript Development and Printing*

The manuscripts are being progressively tried out in the four areas in which there are a total of 50 primary schools being used: Lampung (southern Sumatra), Bone (southern Sulawesi), Kuningan (West Java) and Jogjakarta (Central Java). The manuscripts are tested by a battery of pretests and post test at quarterly intervals from which an item analysis is put together by manual methods. These results are correlated with the answers to teachers' questionnaires and the observations of the area supervisors. The manuscripts which are to be printed in 1975 are Bahasa Indonesia III, Mathematics I, and Social Studies III, each with their teachers' guides.

These books which total some 31 million will be ready for printing by local firms during July to September after which they will be distributed to schools. Manuscripts which are being tested in the try-out schools in 1975 are those of Bahasa Indonesia IV, Social Studies IV and Mathematics IV. Some visits are made by project staff and UNESCO to try-out areas and much reliance is placed on area supervisors for the administration of the testing. A national up-grading course for all try-out teachers is held each year.

(b) Teacher Training (In-Service)

The teacher training affects some 220,000 educators and teachers of the following categories:

- (i) PPSU key personnel
- (ii) Regency and district supervisors
- (iii) Mobile tutors
- (iv) Primary teachers and principals

Key personnel of the supervisors and the PPSU, as well as the mobile tutors have so far been trained at national level and other up-grading has been carried out in the provinces. Although still unprovided with vehicles and equipment from the project, mobile tutors in most of the provinces have begun their up-grading sessions in the central schools which they reach by public transport. When in full operation each mobile team will visit about 25 central primary schools in its own area. Each of these central schools will be used for conducting the in-service training for a further 20-30 primary schools in the area. Within a general framework devised for the up-grading in the 17 inner provinces, the PPSU's plan the scheduling of the up-grading but more detailed plans have still to be made for the 9 outer provinces where communications are difficult. Plans have also been drawn for a prototype teaching aids kit, that has still to be developed and tested.

A great deal of problem solving has to be carried out at each stage of the project and it is in this area that UNESCO can assist the senior Indonesian members of project so that the main project activities, mass book production and teacher training, can be properly integrated to improve the quality of the learning in elementary schools.

4. Functions

The Educational Media Specialist will co-operate with the director of the Project Implementation Unit (PIU) and its Administrator/Programmer to ensure that the materials and equipment are effectively used and maintained. It is essential that the incumbent be able to promote the use of local materials in the production of suitable teaching/learning aids. In particular the expert will:

- (a) assist on all matters relating to the distribution and maintenance of teaching/learning equipment under the control of the project;

- (c) advise and assist on all matters of textbook distribution and, in particular, on modifications that may be needed in the existing schedules for distribution;

- (e) support the activities of the PIU team in planning a prototype teaching aids kit and assist this unit to implement the kits in all primary schools;
- (f) co-ordinate the activities of the Teaching Aids Centre Bandung and similar centres as they introduce the new teaching/learning aids.

CONSUMER PRICE INDEX, FREETOWN—1ST QUARTER, 1976

The revised Freetown Consumer Price Index for the 1st quarter, 1976 was 203.3 as compared to 208.0 in the 4th quarter, 1975. This shows a drop of 4.7 points or 2.3 per cent over the previous quarter.

The most important drop among the major group items was for "Food and Drinks" which dropped by 5.2 per cent over the previous period. The index (1961=100) indicates the average movement of retail prices of selected items known as "market basket" which represents the purchases of the low income African families in Freetown.

Food and Drinks: There was a drop of 11.9 points mainly due to substantial decreases in the average prices of fresh fish, rice, potato leaves, fresh tomato, bread, foofoo, tinned tomato puree, bananas, mangoes and oranges. In contrast to the previous quarter, the average prices of the last three items went down due to the season in question. The drops were however partially offset by substantial increases in the average prices of dried bonga, onions, small and big peppers, pounded groundnut, okra, groundnut oil and margarine.

Housing: In contrast to the Food and Drinks index, the Housing index rose by 6.6 points or 3.5 per cent over the previous period. These increases were due to slight increases in the average prices of chairs, putty, brooms and a considerable increase in the average price of firewood.

Clothing: The Clothing index rose by 6.1 points or 3.9 per cent over the previous period. This increase was largely accounted for by increases in the average prices of ladies cotton blouses, ladies nylon slips, ladies cotton headties, men's cotton shirts and men's street leather shoes. The festivities at this period might have probably accounted for these substantial increases in prices of the items so affected. These increases were offset by relative decreases in the average prices of cotton prints, and tailoring of ladies garments (tamulay).

Miscellaneous: Unlike the previous high increase noted in this index, there was only a slight increase of 2.3 points or 1.3 per cent over the previous quarter largely due to increase in the average prices of headache pills (phensic), cough medicine (liquifruta) and worm medicine (antepar). There was however a decrease in the average charges for visit to Druggists and Union dues.
